A. Personal Statement

I am currently employed part-time at the Cancer Research Center, University of Guam as a Research Associate/Community Health Educator since Oct. 2015 to the present under the U54 Cancer Community Outreach Core. I have been active with U54 activities, having served as Community Outreach Research Coordinator during the U54 Cycle One period. I also formerly served as the Guam-based partnership program coordinator for the NCI's Cancer Information Service – Pacific Region/University of Hawaii Cancer Research Center.

Between 2010 to Jan. 2015, I was engaged in assisting Dr. Annette David (Co-Principal Investigator) on two NCI funded U54 community outreach pilot research programs, one NCI supported project, and one study supported by the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health on researching ways to reduce tobacco use among Chamorro and other Micronesian youth on Guam. I have extensive experience in public health administration having worked with the Guam Department of Public Health and Social Services for over 17 years, and strong community health partnership and engagement experience having worked five years (2005-2010) with the National Cancer Institute's Cancer Information Service Pacific Region. During my employment with the DPHSS as Health Services Administrator, I administered the Chronic Disease Prevention and Control Program, the Nutrition Health Services Program, the Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program, the Preventive Health Program, and the Health Education Program. I have developed longstanding relationships and have actively networked with the Guam Comprehensive Cancer Control Coalition, Non-Communicable Disease Consortium, UOG Chuukese Student Organization, Youth for Youth LIVE! Guam (youth organization). I have served as Vice Chair as well as the Chairperson of the Guam Comprehensive Cancer Control Coalition and have been an active coalition member since 2005. I have been and continue to be engaged in numerous activities aimed to reduce cancer health disparities in Guam. I am of Pacific Islander/Chamorro descent and have lived on Guam most of my life. All these attributes and skill sets will greatly assist me in increasing awareness and educating the Guam community about cancer through the Cancer Community Outreach Core.
